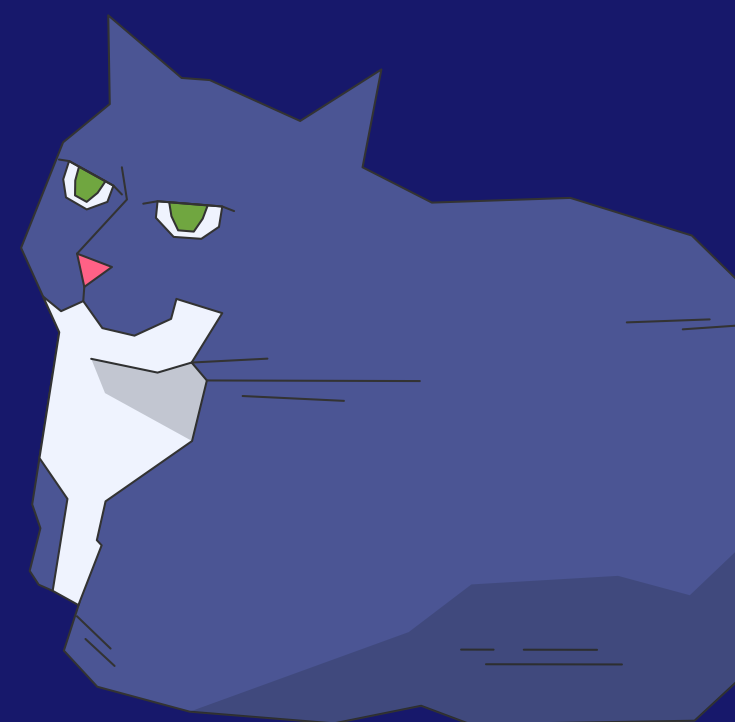

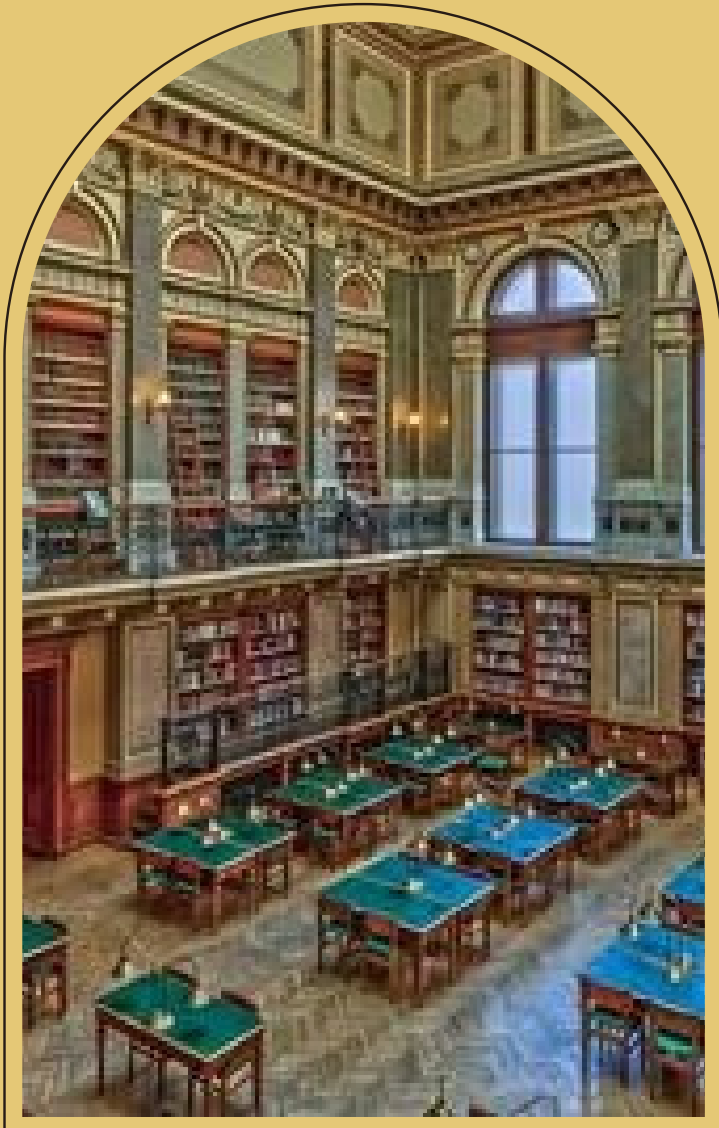
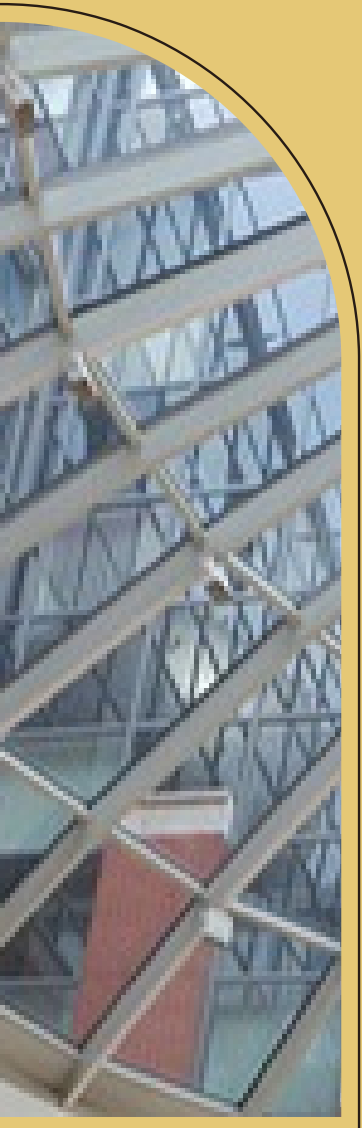

OTHER LIBRARIES IN BUDAPEST

WORTH TO VISIT

National Széchenyi Library – www.oszk.hu/en

It's located in the rear wing of the Royal Palace, facing toward Buda. It's a national library, the biggest collection including some surviving books of King Mathias, the legendary king of the Renaissance (their name is "Corvina", as the ensign of the king was the raven (called corvus in Latin)).

Library of the Parliament – www.ogyk.hu/en

The house of the Hungarian Parliament established the library at the end of the 1860's. In 1902, the library moved to the newly built Parliament on the bank of Danube. It only became a public collection in 1952; until that time, access was permitted only to institutions and professionals.

It's a special national research library. Since its foundation in 1826, it has dedicated itself to supporting scientific and scholarly research and safeguarding its precious collections.

Metropolitan Ervin Szabó Library – <https://fszek.hu/en>

It's located in a magnificent neo-Baroque palace completed in 1889, as well as in a new wing – presently one of the most interesting library interiors of Europe. The café is found in the former stables.

National Library of Foreign Language – <https://www.oik.hu/rolunk>

Originally built for Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA), a Russian language library was opened in 1956 under the name of "Gorky Library", which later started to collect other foreign language pieces, as well. Many people in Budapest call it "Gorky" even today. It has a very pleasant atmosphere with a rich selection of journals.

Founded by George Soros in June 1992, the CEU Library is located in the heart of downtown Budapest and holds the largest collection of English-language materials in the social sciences and humanities in Central and Eastern Europe.

HUNGARIAN LANGUAGE COURSES

General Hungarian Language Courses – Eötvös Loránd University offers Hungarian language and culture courses covering all levels from complete beginner (A1) to proficiency levels (C2).

The 10-11-week courses start at the beginning of both spring and autumn semesters. Students get 3 or 6 ECTS credits after successfully completing the course.

CLIMATE

Hungary has a typical continental climate with hot, dry summers and mildly cold snowy winters. There are four seasons in Hungary. The average annual temperature is 9.7 °C (49.5 °F). The average high temperature in the summer is 26 to 32 °C (78 to 89 °F) and temperature can climb up to 38 °C on the hottest days in July-August. The average low temperatures might drop below 10 °C on the coldest days. Generally, the weather is warmest from May to September.

GEOGRAPHY

Hungary is situated in the Carpathian Basin. The country's major river is the Danube, dividing the country almost in half. Its two longest rivers are called Danube and Tisza. Two-thirds of Hungary's geographic area are less than 200 meters above sea level. Hungary's highest point is the mountain Kékes (1015m) located in the Mátra mountain range. The lowest point, 77m above sea level lies near Szeged. Lake Balaton is the largest lake in Central Europe, sometimes referred to as the 'Hungarian Sea'. It is 78 km long and between 3-14 km wide. It's one of the biggest tourist attractions of the country, and lots of the Hungarians spend the summer holiday by the lake.

HUNGARIAN CUISINE

Hungarian food is often spicy. It frequently uses paprika (and paprika powder, hot or 'sweet'), black pepper and onions. Potatoes are also commonly used in many dishes. Hungarians are passionate about their soups, desserts and stuffed pancakes. Dishes you must taste while staying in Hungary:

Fish Soup – is made of fish and paprika

Goulash Soup – is a soup of meat and vegetables, seasoned with paprika and other spices

Pörkölt – is delicious, juicy meat dish, prepared of beef/pork, chopped onion, paprika, other spices, you can eat it either with boiled potato or noodles

Stuffed cabbage – cabbage leaves stuffed with rice and ground pork with a tangy and spicy tomato

Chimney Cake („kürtös kalács”) – popular Hungarian sweet street snack

Lángos – deep-fried flat bread, eaten with garlic sauce, cheese, sour cream

Túró Rudi – chocolated curd cheese

Dobos Cake – made with thin layers of sponge cake, bittersweet chocolate buttercream, and a brittle caramel top layer

Beigli – Walnut/poppy seed roll, traditional Christmas cake

Pálinka – special fruit brandy.

The Hungarian National Assembly (the House of Parliament)

The Parliament building, a magnificent example of Neo-Gothic architecture, is just over 100 years old. It's the third largest Parliament building in the world and is also home to the Hungarian Crown Jewels.

Heroes' Square

Heroes' Square is the largest and most impressive square of the city. The Millennium Monument standing in the middle of the square was erected in 1896 to commemorate the 1000th anniversary of the Magyars' arrival to the Carpathian Basin. The Museum of Fine Arts is located on the northern side of the square.



Chain Bridge

The Chain Bridge was the first bridge to permanently connect Buda and Pest. At the time of its completion, Chain Bridge was considered to be one of the wonders of the world. Crossing the bridge is just a short walk, and no matter which direction you go, the view is beautiful.



Buda Castle Hill

The Castle Hill, which includes the Royal Palace, the Fishermen's Bastion and Matthias Church, is easily visible from everywhere in Budapest. Exploring beautiful buildings and cobblestone streets in the Castle District can take an entire day, but it is time well spent.



Margaret Island

Margaret Island now serves as a recreational park in the centre of the Danube River. It is a great place to walk, swim a few laps or go for a run. During summer months, bicycles are also available for rent. Since vehicles are prohibited, the island is a fantastic escape from the city's traffic.

Central Market Hall

The spectacular Central Market Hall is a good source of Hungarian products. You can also make it a pit-stop for a quick bite of traditional Hungarian food when touring the city. Shop with the locals for meat, cheese, fruits, vegetable, and pastries.



Public Transport

FROM THE AIRPORT

Budapest Airport is situated some 20 km to the south-east from the city centre. How to reach the city centre from Budapest International Airport? For up-to-date schedules and ticket information, please visit:

BUS 100E

provides a direct connection between Budapest Airport and the city centre, stopping at Kálvin tér, Astoria and Deák Ferenc tér.

The service operates 24/7, with buses running every 5–20 minutes depending on the time of day.

Please note that a special Airport Shuttle Bus Single Ticket is required. Standard public transport tickets and most travel passes are not valid on bus 100E.

The regular Airport Shuttle ticket costs HUF 2,500.

Tickets can be purchased:

- in the BudapestGO app,
- at ticket vending machines at the airport,
- at BKK customer service points,
- or directly on board using a bank card through the Budapest Pay&GO system.

BUS 200E

connects Budapest Airport with Kőbánya-Kispest, the southern terminus of Metro Line M3. From Kőbánya-Kispest, passengers can take the M3 metro towards Újpest-központ to reach the city centre.

Bus 200E operates 24/7. During the night, passengers may need to transfer to night services at certain times.

A standard public transport ticket or valid travel pass can be used on bus 200E and the metro. A single ticket costs HUF 500 if purchased in advance through the BudapestGO app, ticket vending machines, customer service centres, or other official sales points. Tickets purchased from the bus driver cost HUF 700 and can only be bought with cash.

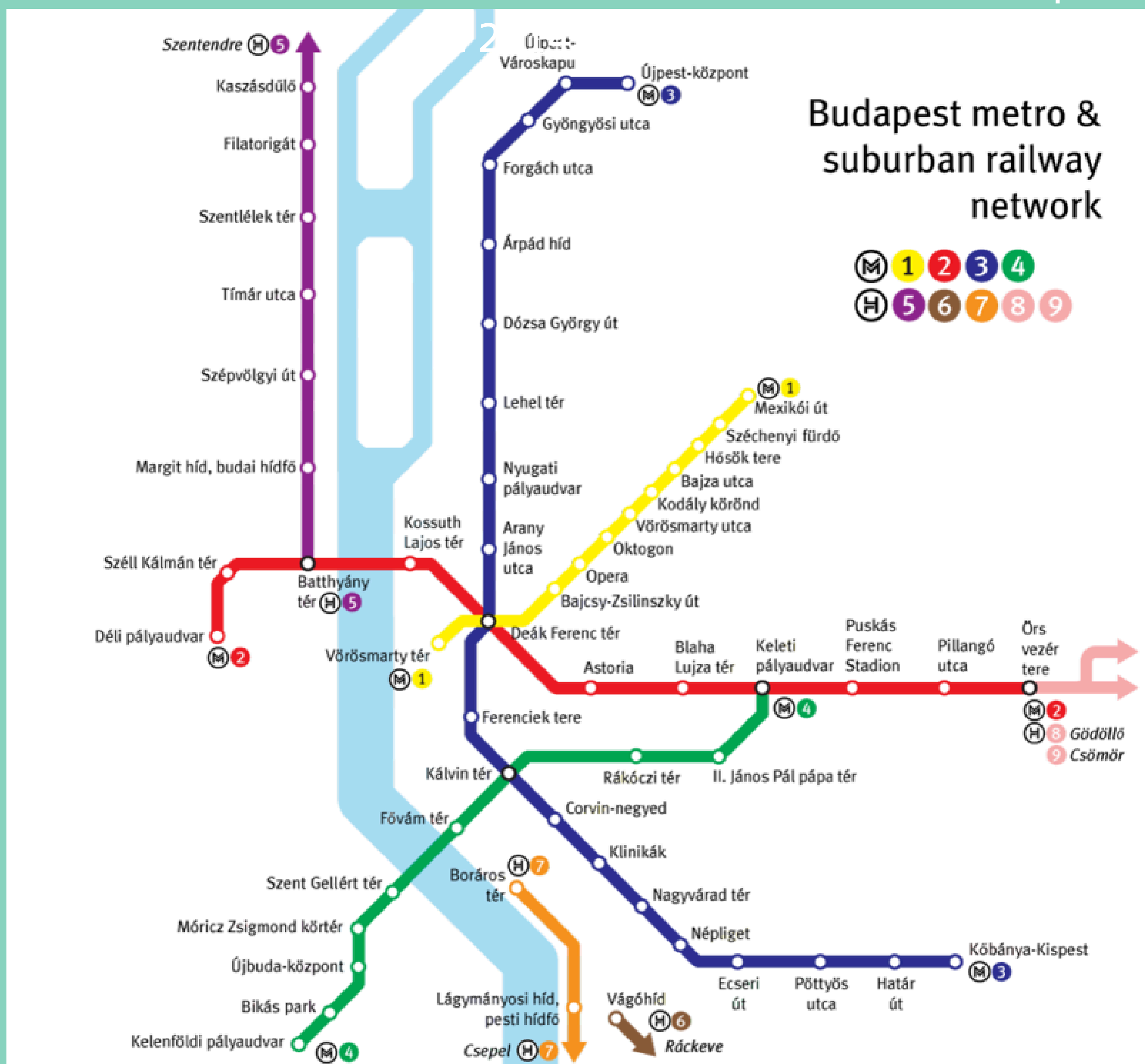
METRO LINES

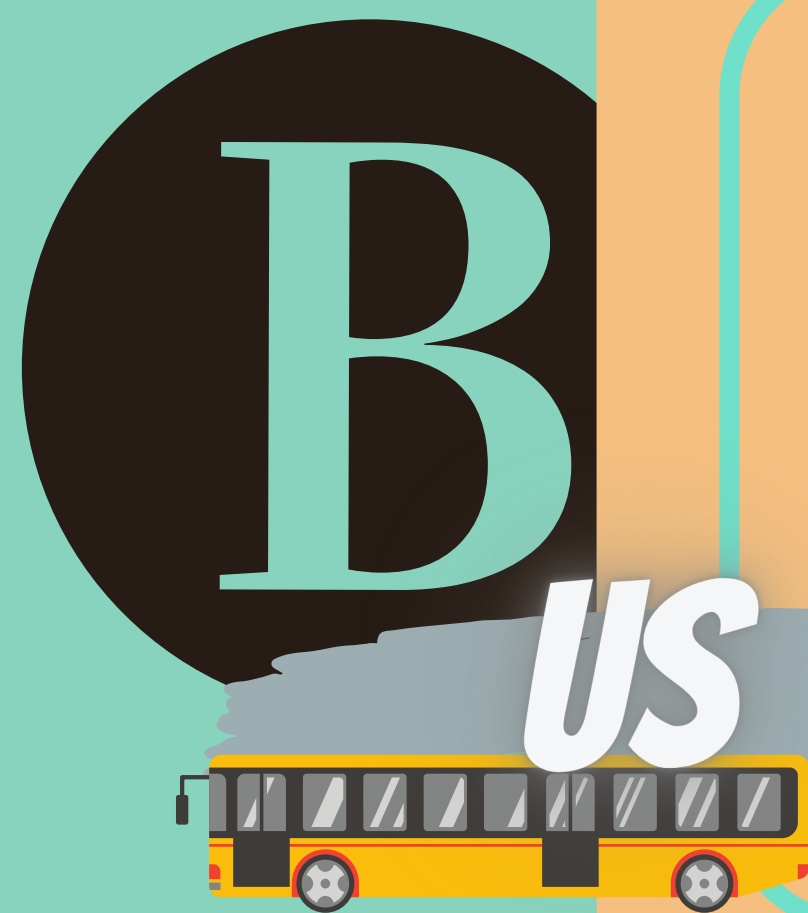
Metro services run from 4:30 until around midnight (extended hours on Fridays and Saturdays).

Budapest metro has four lines:

- M1 or the Yellow Line: between Vörösmarty tér and Mexikói út
- M2 or the Red Line: between Déli pályaudvar and Örs vezér tere
 - M3 or the Blue Line: between Újpest Központ and Kőbánya-Kispest*
- M4 or the Green Line: between Kelenföld vasútállomás and Keleti pályaudvar

The Yellow Line is the oldest subway line in Hungary and also in mainland Europe. It was opened in 1896 for the Millennium celebrations. The newest line is the Green Line which was opened

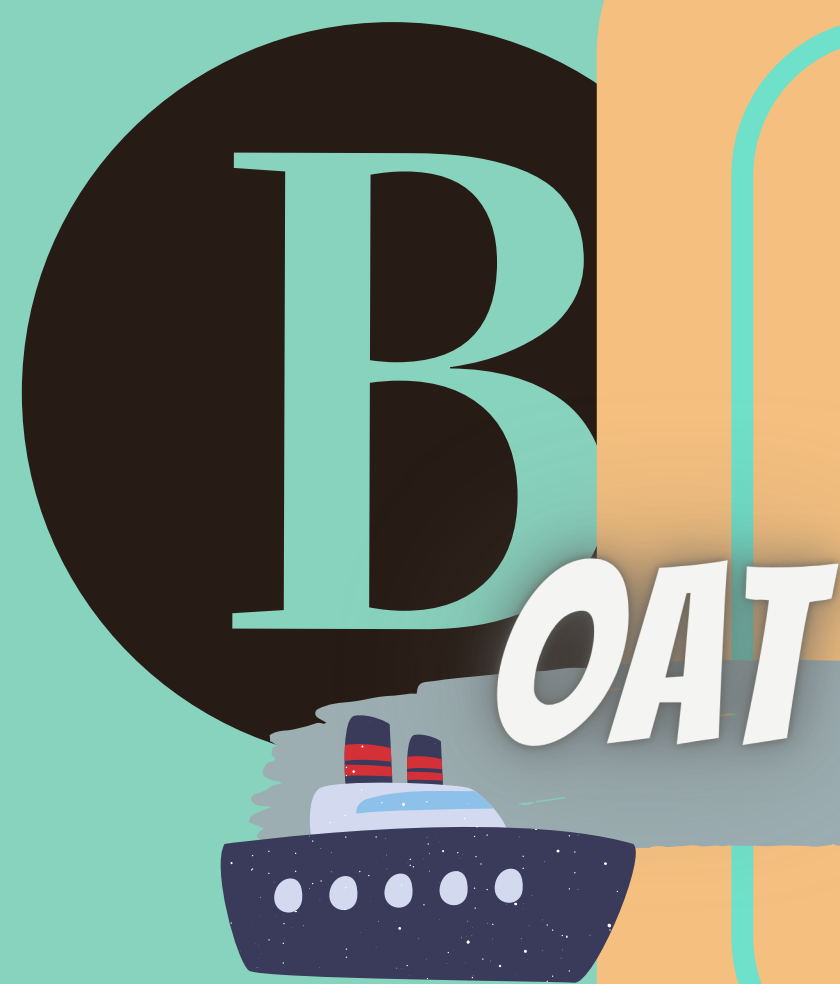




Budapest has an extensive bus network covering both the city centre and suburban areas. Some routes operate as express services, indicated by an “E” after the route number (e.g. 100E and 200E).

Several bus routes operate throughout the night. Night services usually run between midnight and approximately 4:00 a.m. and are identified by route numbers starting with 9. Frequencies vary: major routes may run every 10–15 minutes, while suburban services may operate only once or twice per hour.

Public boat services on the Danube operate on selected routes and may be available seasonally.

Boat services offer a unique way to enjoy Budapest’s riverside landmarks, including the Parliament, Buda Castle and several of the city’s famous bridges. Routes, operating periods and fares may vary, therefore visitors are advised to check the latest information before travelling.

Bicycle-Sharing Network of BUBI

The Bubi bike-sharing scheme is a bicycle-sharing network in Budapest. The apple-green bikes can be hired from and returned to any docking station found at major transport hubs in the city centre. So far 1,150 bikes can be hired from 99 docking stations in the centre of Budapest.
