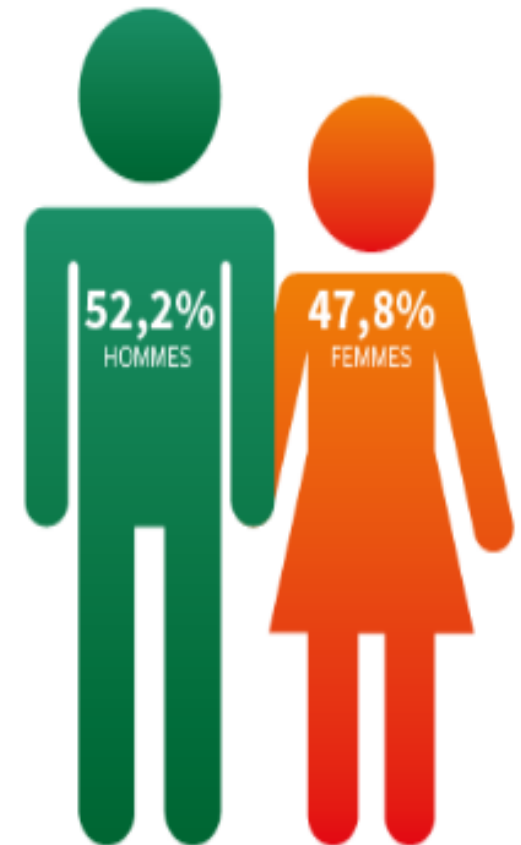

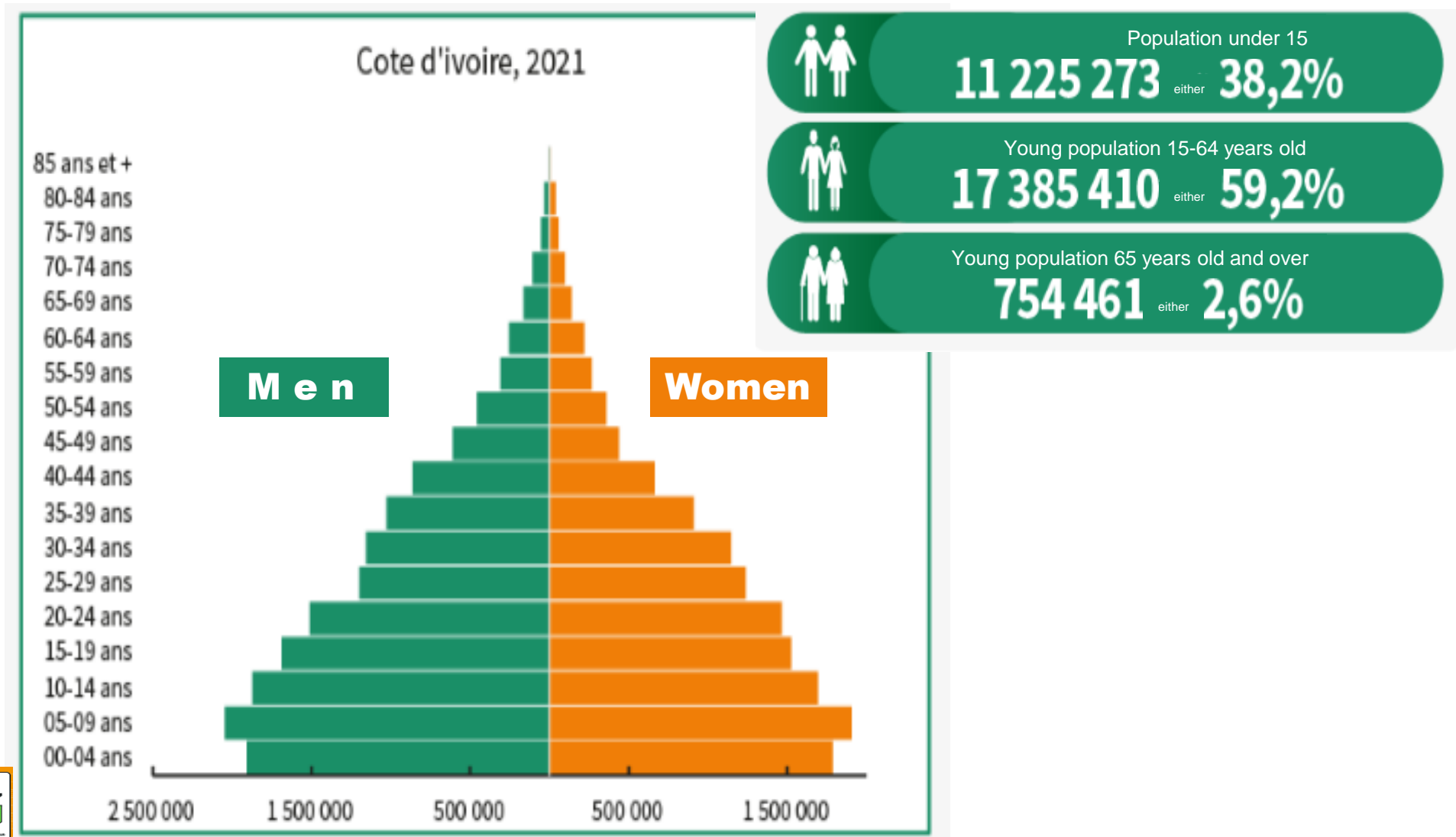

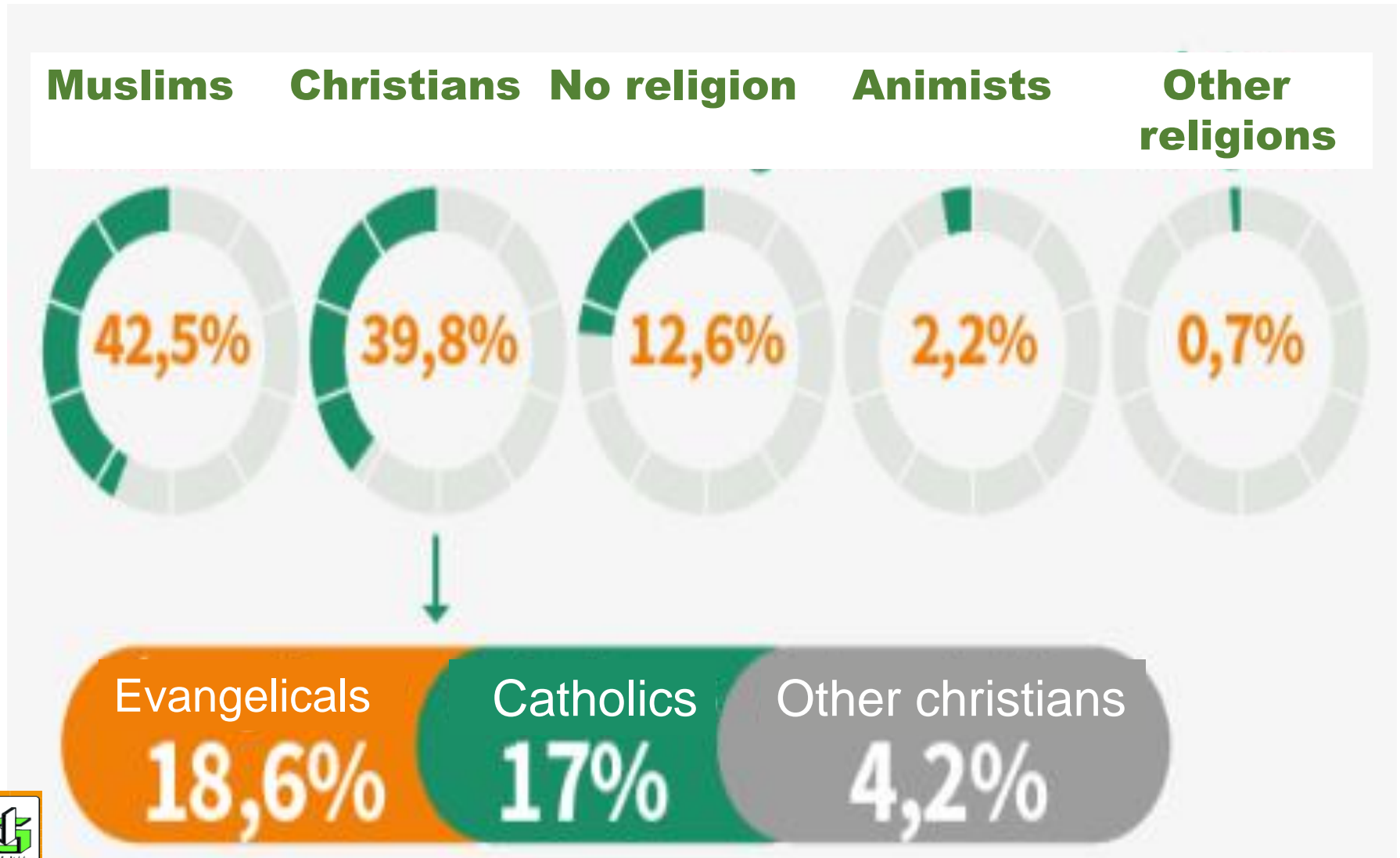

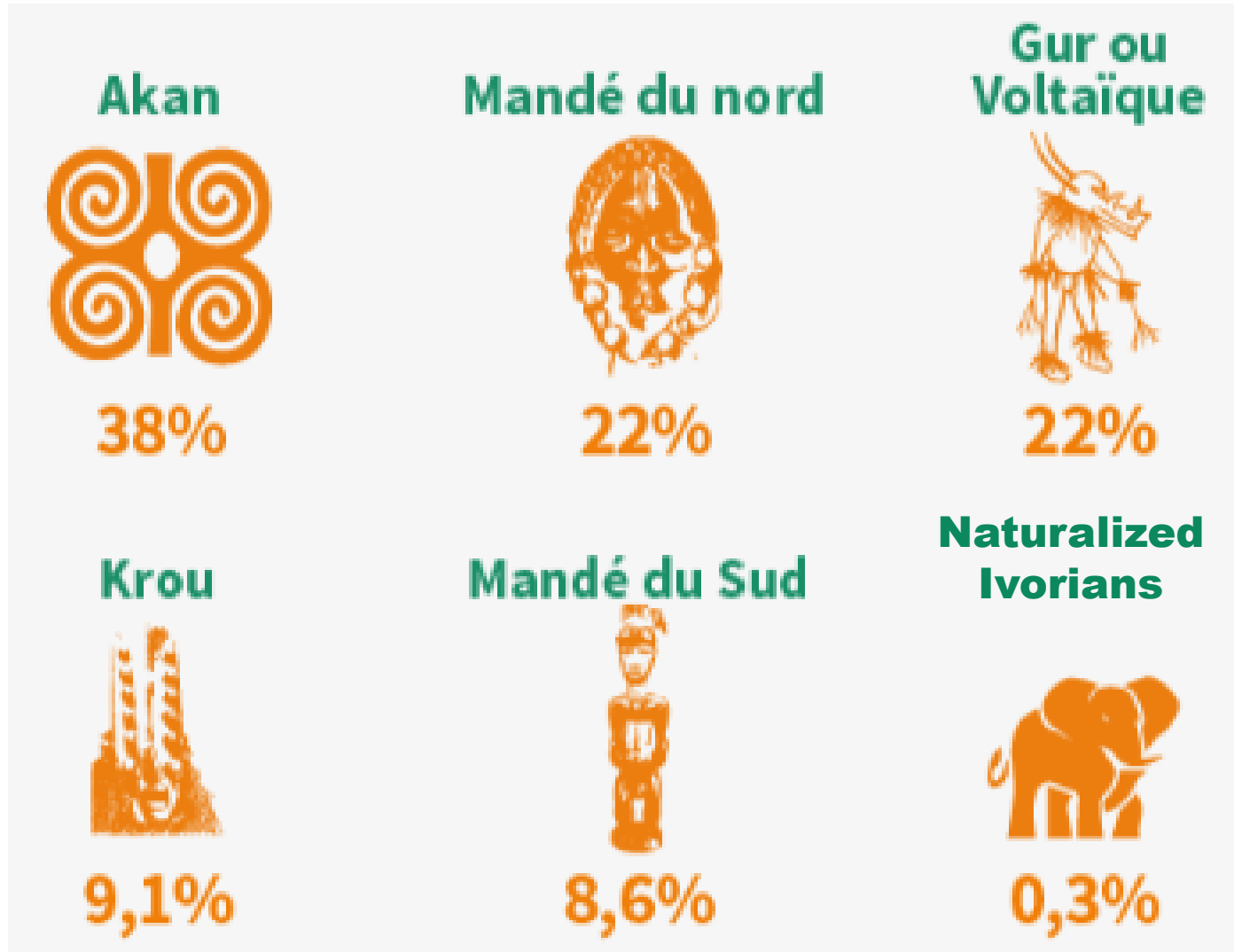

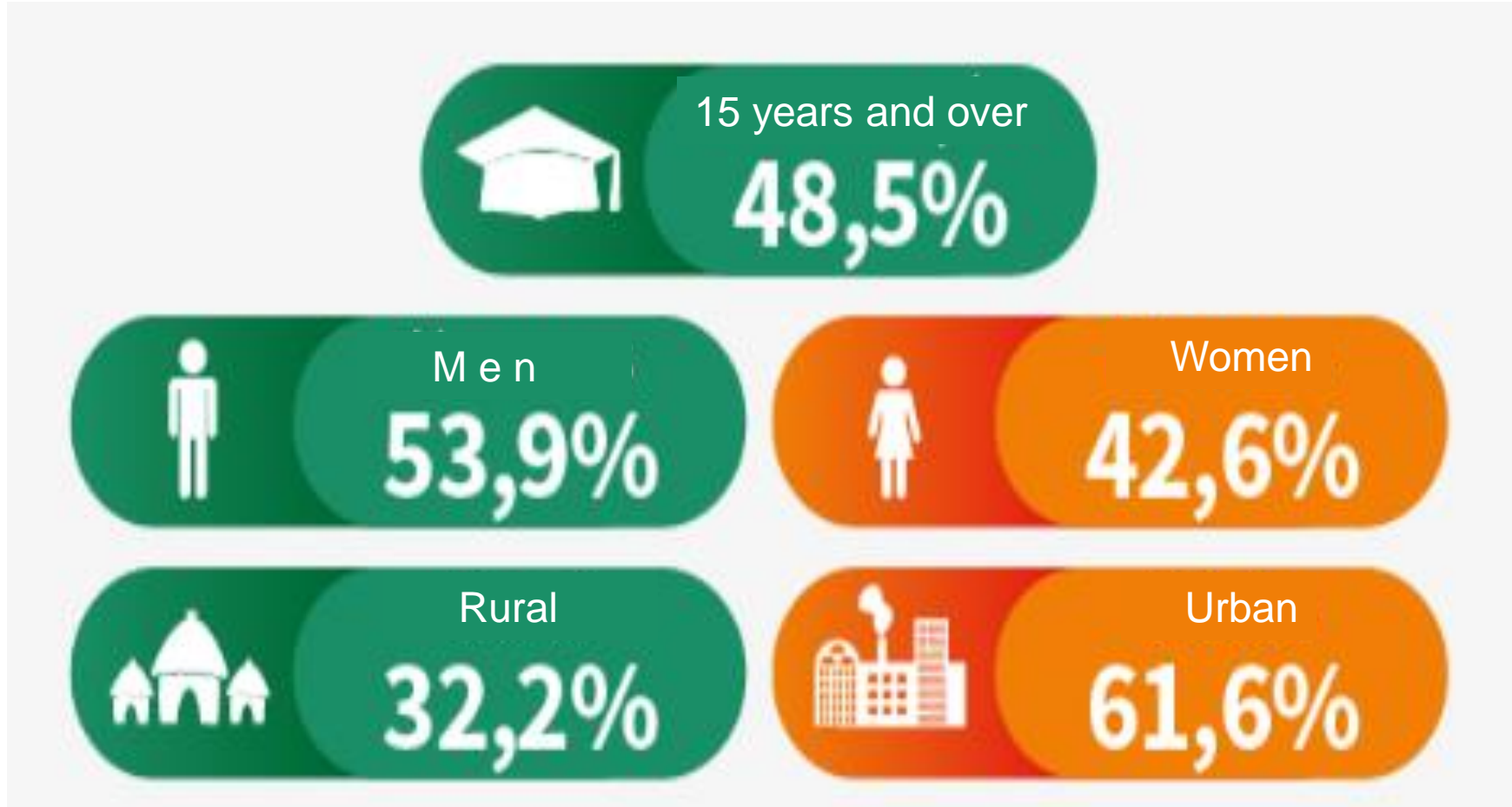

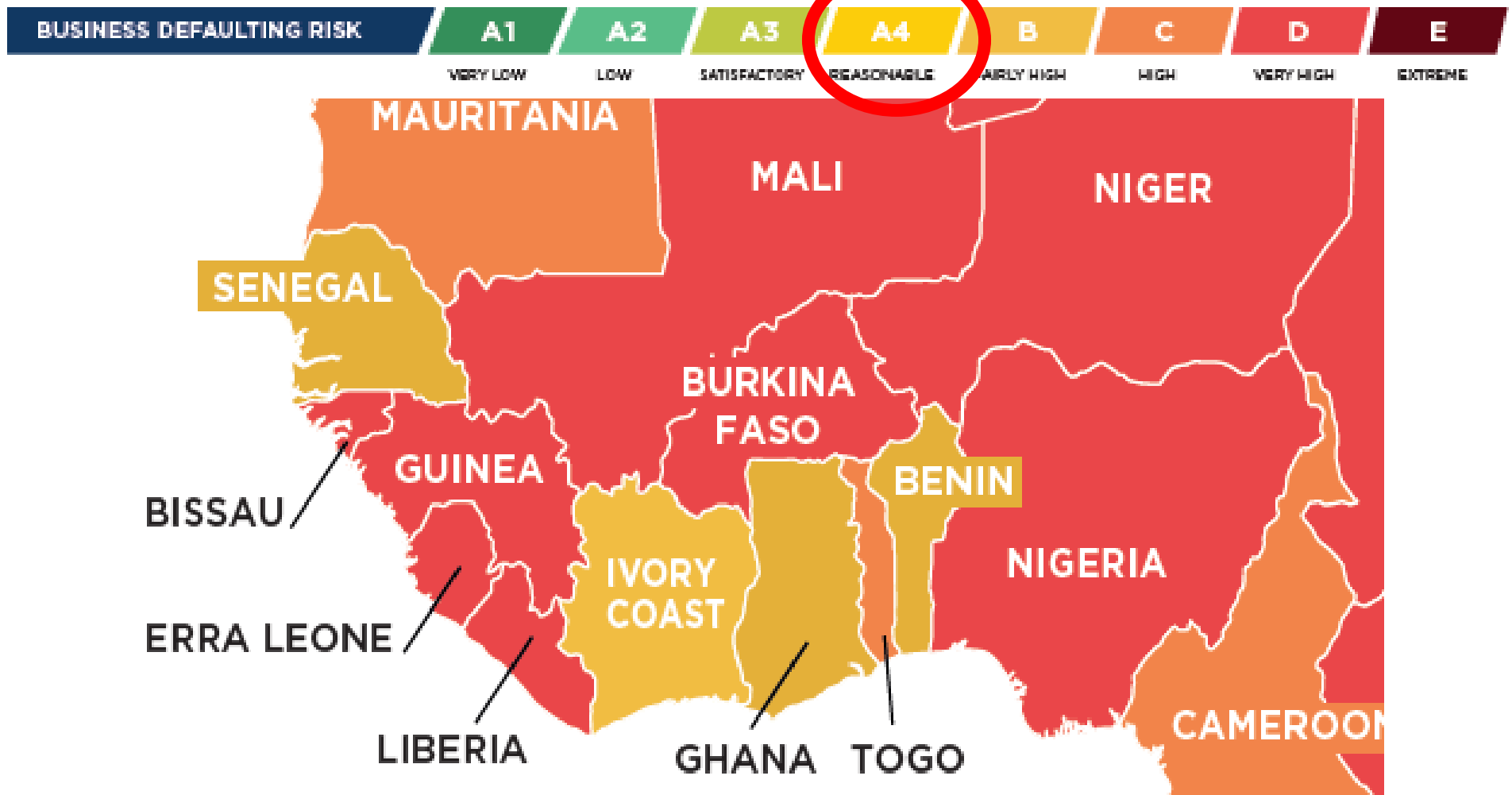

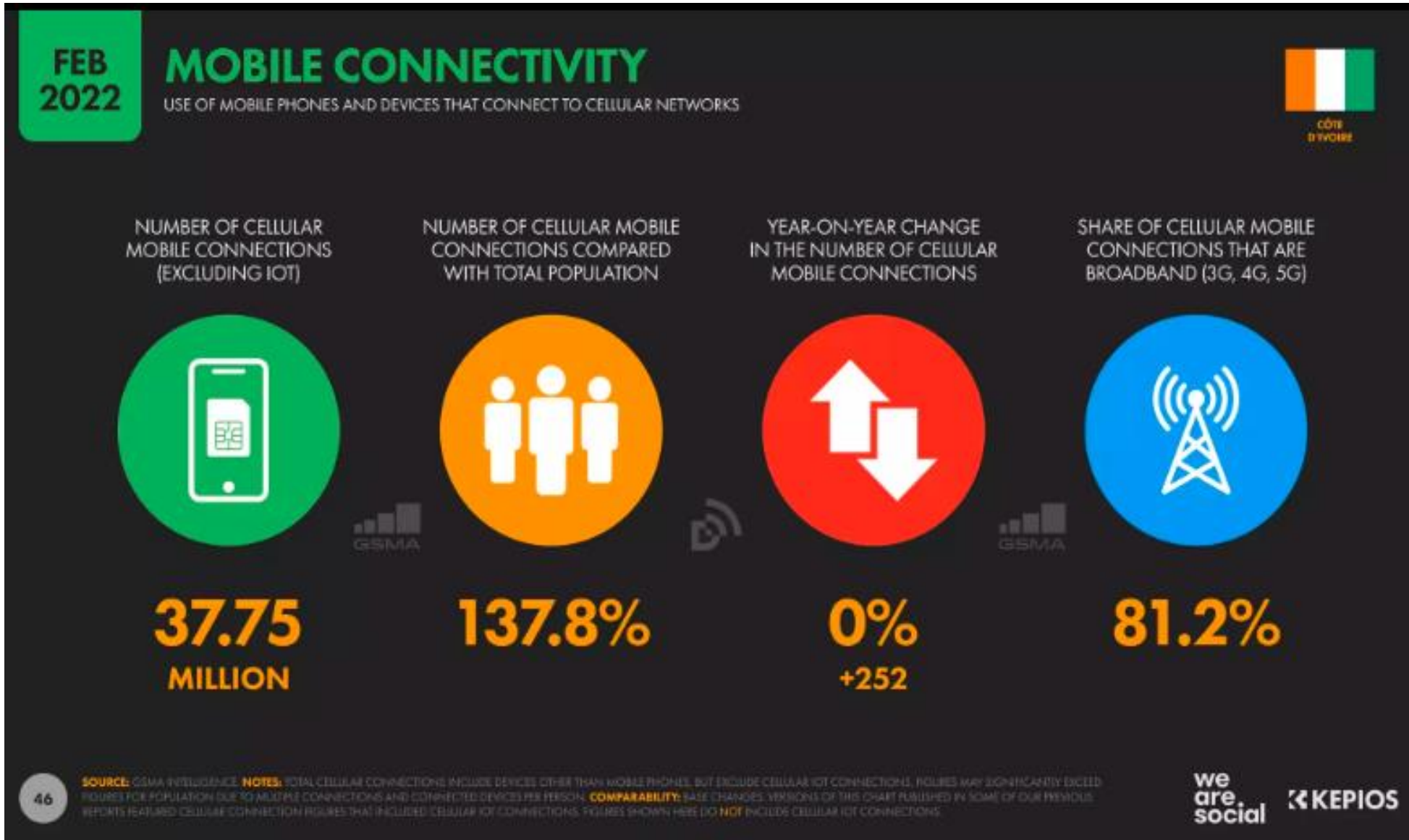
COUNTRY RISK ASSESSMENT

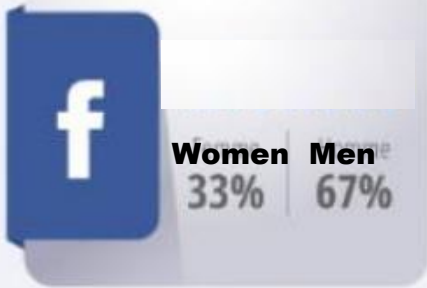
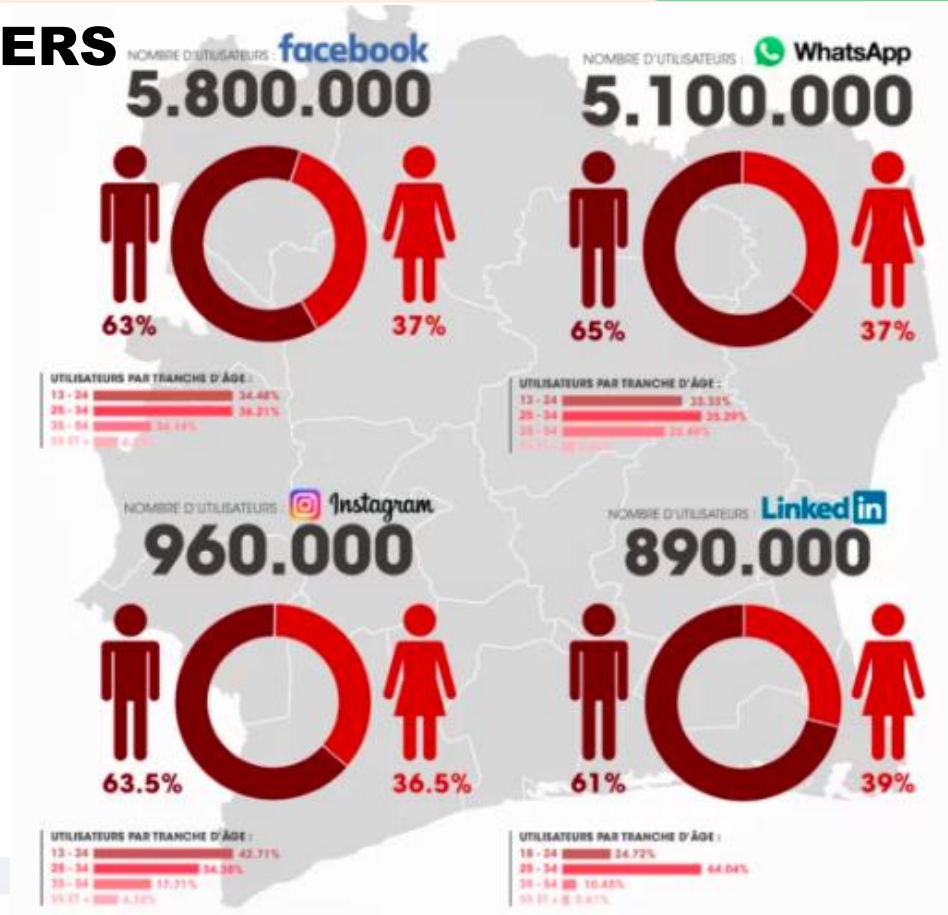

4.2. Education cycles

4.2.1. Primary cycle

- The pre-school level covering three sections:
 - small section
 - middle section
 - large section
- The primary cycle has six levels
 - 1st and 2nd year preparatory courses
 - 1st year elementary course
 - 2nd year elementary course
 - 1st year middle course
 - 2nd year middle course

4.2.2. Secondary cycle

The secondary education is subdivided into two cycles:

- four classes for the first cycle and
- three for the second cycle

4.2.3. Technical and vocational education

- Example: the Félix Houphouët-Boigny National Polytechnic Institute (INPHB)

4.2.4. Higher Education

- State universities: 7 universities: 2 in Abidjan, 5 in the countryside
 - 1. Félix Houphouët-Boigny University
 - 2. Nangui Abrogoua University
 - 3. Alassane Ouattara University (Bouake)
 - 4. University of Man (Man) (multidisciplinary: scientific and technical, local, rural and community development)
 - 5. Jean Lorougnon Guédé University (Daloa)
 - 6. Peleforo Gbon Coulibaly University (Korhogo)
 - 7. San Pedro University: NEW (4 Training and Research Units and 2 schools)
 - 8. Virtual University
 - **Under construction:** Bondoukou University
- Private universities
- Thematic universities

4.3. The Félix Houphouët-Boigny University

- Built on an area of approximately 205 ha, the UFHB includes within it:
 - 13 training and research units (UFR);
 - 2 independent research centers;
 - 1 continuing education school;
 - 14 institutes and research centers;
 - 141 buildings;
 - 1355 teacher-researchers;
 - 88 full-time researchers;
 - 805 officers;
 - approximately 70,000 students
- Main training and research Units:
 - LANGUAGE, LITERATURE AND CIVILIZATION Training and Research Units (LLC)
 - HUMAN AND SOCIAL SCIENCES (SHS) Training and Research Units
 - Information Communication Arts (ICA) Training and Research Units
 - MATHS INFO Training and Research Units.
 - STRUCTURES OF MATTER SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY Training and Research Units (SSMT)
 - BIOSCIENCES Training and Research Units**
 - Earth Sciences and Mining Resources Training and Research Units (STRM)

5.3. Erasmus +

- Erasmus+ is a scholarship program of the European Union, this is an effective form of educational cooperation, it holds many opportunities for the exchange of experiences of educational and research professionals.
- In addition to ELTE, the Faculty of Agriculture of the University of Szeged (SZTE) is also determined to open up to Africa, after its ongoing cooperation in North Africa, it also wants to establish meaningful relations with several higher education institutions in sub-Saharan Africa, among them is the Université Peleforo Gon Coulibaly from the Ivory Coast (<https://univ-pgc.edu.ci/>)
- If the plan succeeds, the first step will be the opportunity for some teachers and students to travel professionally to Hungary

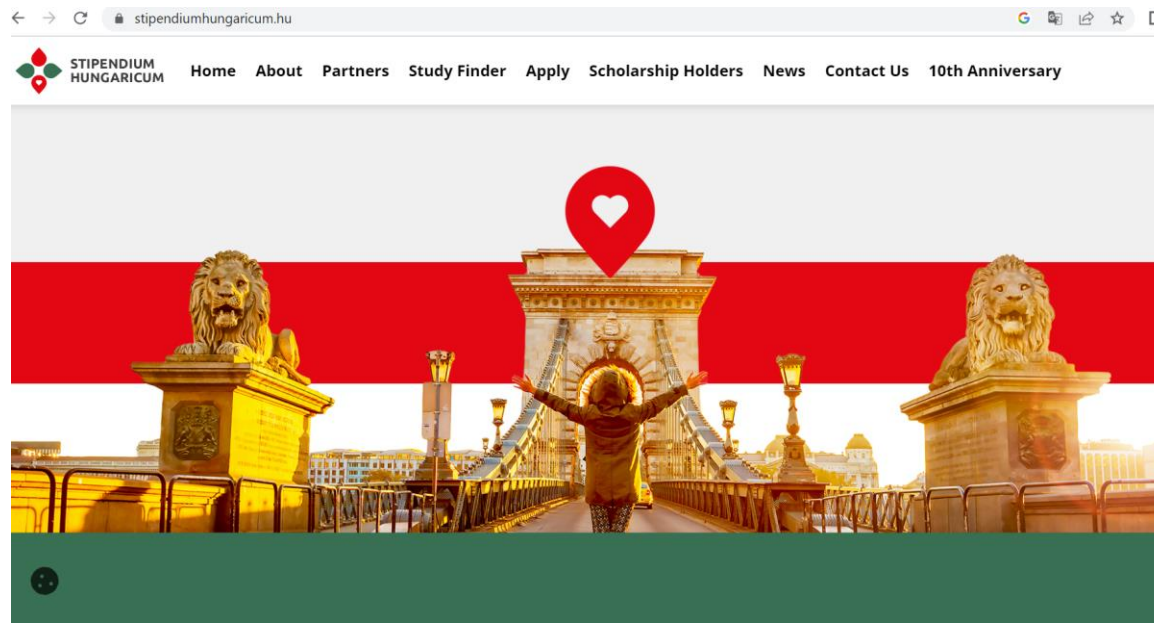

5.4. Stipendium Hungaricum (www.stipendiumhungaricum.hu)

- The Hungarian Government established the Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship program to promote the internationalization of Hungarian higher education and to attract top international students from all around the world who can establish personal and professional links to Hungary while enjoying high-quality education in the heart of Europe.
- At the end of last year, the Ivorian government accepted the Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship: the Hungarian government is offering to 10 Ivorian students to follow their studies in a Hungarian university.
